The Global Award for Sustainable Architecture™ celebrates its 18th edition in 2025 under the theme "Architecture Is Construction." Founded in 2006 by architect and researcher Jana Revedin, this international award honors five architects, urban planners, or landscape designers for their visionary commitment to sustainability and innovation.

The theme of the 2025 edition highlights the structuring role of architecture in addressing today's challenges in sustainable construction, a field in which Saint-Gobain, the Official Partner of the award, plays a key role.

"Today's architects, engineers, and landscape designers embody a profound paradigm shift in the way we live and build, as they rise to meet the climate and social challenges of our time. I am proud to

The Global Award for Sustainable Architecture™ was founded in 2006 by architect and researcher Jana Revedin. It promotes the principles of sustainable development and a participatory approach to architecture, both in the Global North and South. The award's symposium is held under the patronage of UNESCO. The Global Award for Sustainable Architecture™ has recognized 90 laureates from around the world

who share the ethics of sustainable architecture. This international community is actively engaged in research, experimentation, and education in the fields of architecture, urban renewal, and academic social responsibility. About Jana Revedin Born in Constance, Germany, Jana Revedin is an

architect, a graduate of the Politecnico di Milano, and holds a PhD in architecture and urban planning from the luav University of Venice. She is accredited to supervise research. A tenured professor at the École Spéciale d'Architecture in Paris, she is a member of the CNRS research laboratory "Environment, City, Society" and serves as UNESCO delegate to the EDUCOM Education and Research Commission of the International Union of Architects (UIA). She founded her architecture firm in Venice in 1996 and has taught at the luav University of Venice, as well as at the universities of Umea and Karlskrona in Sweden. In 2006, Jana Revedin created the Global Award

for Sustainable Architecture™, initiating a global platform for scientific and professional exchange and experimentation. Her theory of "radicant design" advocates for the collective

transformation of the contemporary city through an "open work" morphology, implemented via participatory and transdisciplinary processes. She was named Chevalier of the Order of Arts and Letters (2014), awarded the Academy of Architecture's Prospective Medal (2017), and in 2022 was appointed a member of the Academy of Architecture.
